About Joe's Movement Emporium

In 1995, dancer/choreographer Brooke Kidd, along with fellow artist Ajax Joe Drayton, had a unique vision to meet their needs as well as those of the surrounding community. Seeking affordable rehearsal and performance space, the two co-founded Joe's Movement Emporium, a storefront studio in Mt. Rainier, MD, a community that lacked access to the arts. The space soon became recognized as an environment in which every "Joe" would be welcome to express themselves through movement, regardless of experience, body size, or age.

Since then, under the directorship of Kidd, Joe's has evolved from a small, storefront studio to a 20,000 sq. ft. arts center widely-regarded as the cornerstone of an arts-led economic re-development effort in Prince George's County.

Joe's serves as the artistic base to over 25 artists and arts group of all disciplines. Complete with a black box theater, three dance studios and an arts education wing, the facility serves nearly 70,000 individuals annually. As one of the region's most well respected non-profit arts center, Joe's successfully utilizes arts as a vehicle for progressive education and workforce training, serving 3,500 youth last year alone.
